Report

The CS & IT department of Trinity Institute of Professional Studies organized a five day long Professional Week for the BCA students w.e.f. 19/09/2022 to 23rd September 2022. Expert trainers from the IT industry, IT professionals, well-known academicians, cyber security experts, reputed psychologist, alumni entrepreneurs of the institute, were the resource persons in the various sessions of the professional week. In addition there was also a Placement Assessment Test (PAT) for the students as part of the activities

The sessions were conducted in two parallel sessions- one for 5th & the other for 3rd semester students.

Day-1:

The session on “Python Programming and Machine Learning” was conducted by Mr. Ravikant. The different topics he covered were different programming languages, introduction to python programming, basic syntax used in python programming, Data Science and its various steps, Data analysis, EDA, Statistics, Machine Learning, Model Optimization and Deployment, Web Scraping & API Call. The resource person demonstrated Game Development using Python and practical visualization of the same.

The participants get to know about the language, idea of working on data science, and of course the career scope associated with the language & the technology. The session continued from 10:30AM to till 4:30PM.

There were two expert lecture sessions for the 3rd semester students on the first day- first on Networking and the other on e-Commerce. The first lecture was delivered by Dr. Priyank Singhal and he highlighted on concepts of networking: switches, routers, access points, software; different job roles in Networking domain such as Network Administrator/Network Specialist, Network Security Administrator/Specialist, Wireless Network Engineer, SOC Analyst, Cloud Administrator/Engineer, Industrial Network Administrator; the different career trends in networking like Network Automation, Software based Networks, the Cloud, Wireless and Mobile Networks and steps to begin career in networking. He also informed students about different Simulation tool for learning: 8.2(CISCO PACKET TRACER) and



PACKET PRESSED TOOL. He also executed a short practical on PACKET PRESS TOOL. It ended with Q&A session. The second lecture of the day was on e-Commerce delivered by Dr. Bikramjeet Pal. His lecture focused on the importance and the use of E-commerce in our daily lives. He explained that e-commerce is a methodology of modern business which mentions the need of business organisations, vendors and customers to reduce cost and improve the quality of goods and services while increasing the speed of delivery. He explained that e-Commerce refers to the performing online commercial activities, transactions over internet whereas e-Business refers to performing all type of business activities through internet. Both of them are constantly helping upgrade the world into different levels and dimensions. The students found it very insightful and informative

Day -2:

On the 2nd day, the Placement Assessment Test was conducted online in collaboration with Coding Ninja's for 5th semester students. The test commenced at 10:00AM to till 1:00PM. On the other hand Mr. Amit Srivastava from Brain Mentors workshop on Web Development for the 3rd semester students which continues from 10:30AM to till 4:30PM. Students got opportunity to interact and have hands on experience on developing pages and sharing resources on Github.

Day -3:

The 5th semester students were oriented on the Android Development by Mr. Sanjeev Kumar from Debox Global IT Solutions Ltd. on the 3rd day. It was a fruitful session for the participants as the topic was new to the participants. Later, renowned psychologist, Dr. Noopur Chatterjee, conducted a session for the students on Psychology about how to stay positive in any situation.

An alumni interactive session with Mr. Vivek Singh was organized with the 3rd semester students where students raised their queries on many points like how to plan and prepare for career and also the different prospects and dimensions available after completing BCA.

Day -4:

On the 4th day the 5th semester students have sessions on Cyber Security by Mr. Neel Maurya from IICT and an alumni interaction by Mr. Anurag Arora. The 3rd semester students have session by Mr. Himanshu Tarif from IICT.

Day 5:

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

The session started with a warm welcome note followed by the introduction of the new joiner to the TIPS family by the speaker, Prof.(Dr.) Barkha Bahl, Director, TIPS on 18th October 2022. After a brief introductory talk on the purpose and objectives of organizing the session, the speaker started sharing her thoughts on various aspects related to today’s title topic. She explained how achieving an organization’s objectives are totally dependent on its employees. Maintaining work ethics at the work place, following the norms & guidelines as specified by the organization’s rule book and be professional at all stages during the course of their stay in the organization plays a vital role in the growth of the organization as well as of the individual concern. The additional aspect to be kept in mind is that one should continue to upgrade professional competence to meet changing needs of family and communities. 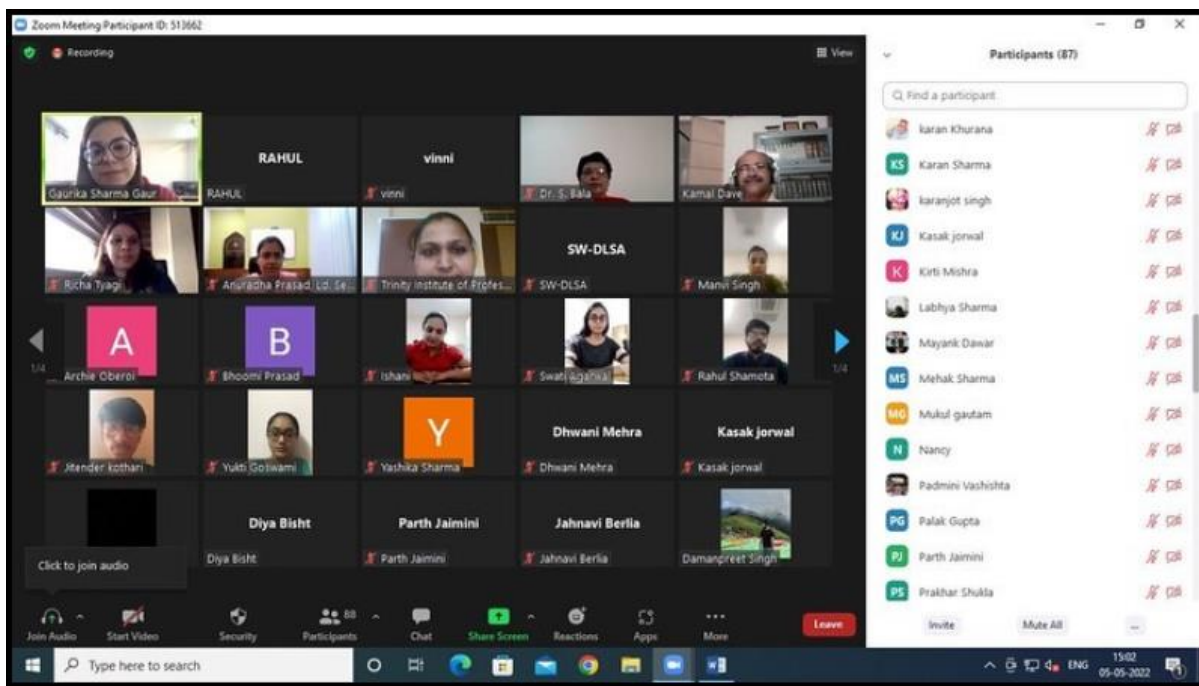

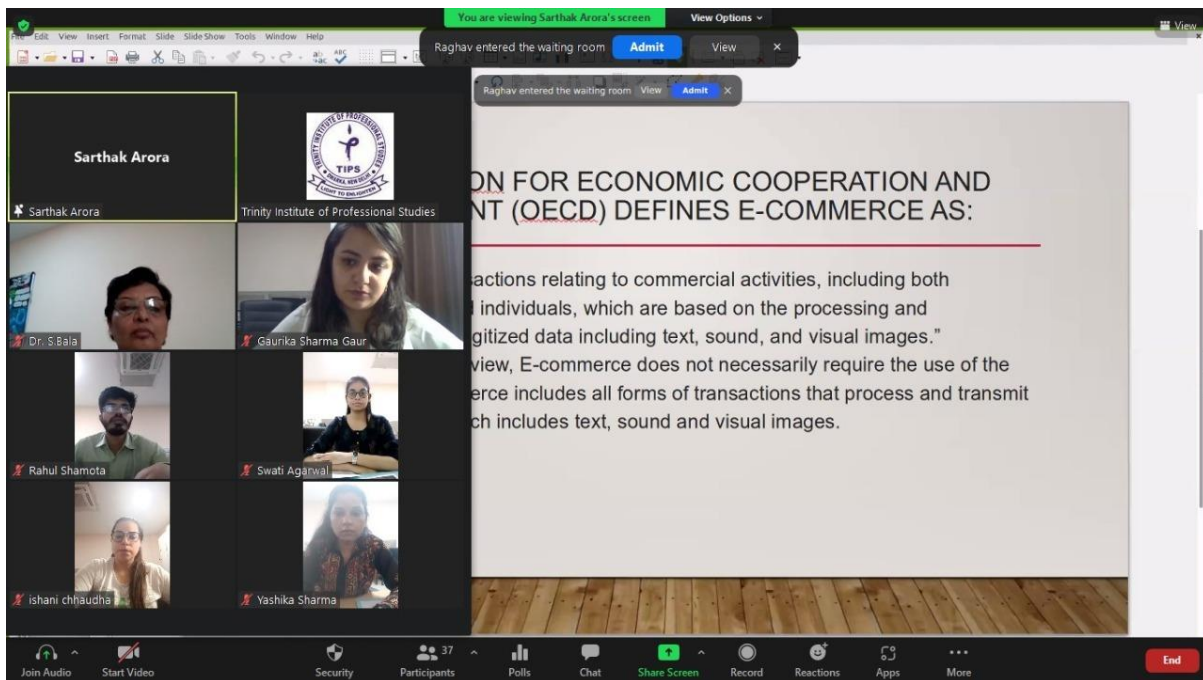
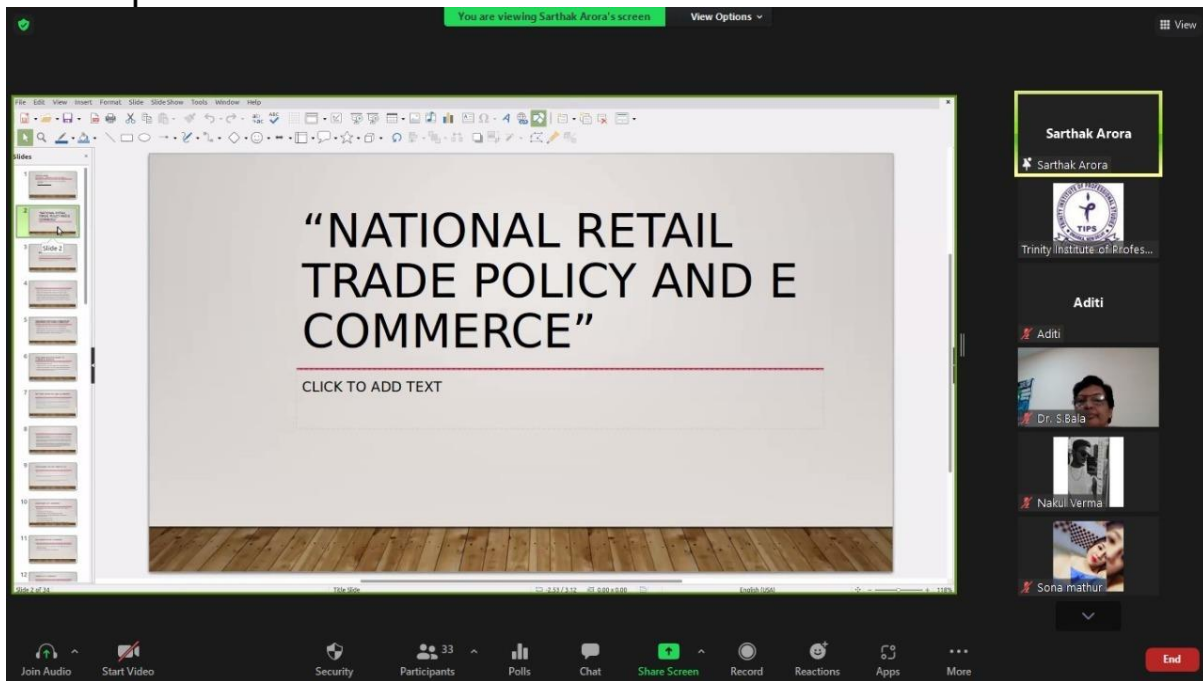

It would also seek to create large-scale employment opportunities, providing an effective consultative and grievance redressal mechanism for the retail sector, for the welfare of traders and their employees.

The legal aid society in collaboration with Moot Court Society of Trinity Institute of Law and Legal Studies organized an Enactment of Crime Scene Investigation and Pre-Trial under the guidance of **Dr. R.K Tandon, Chairman, TIPS, Dwarka** and **Dr. Shashi Bala, Principal Law Department**. *Trinity Legal Aid Society* provides free legal aid to the citizens and spreads awareness by organizing various events whether physically or virtually and aims to make society law abiding and a well vigilant society. It also aims to help its students to develop value-added skills so that they can synchronize themselves with the real-world issues.

The students of First year, second year, third year and Fourth year participated in this event. The students got actively involved and showed great enthusiasm and creativity to convert their message to the audience.

The students were given a chance to have a glimpse of how an investigation and a trial take place when the offense of crime is committed in the society. The crime scene was depicted (chalk was used to highlight the dead body and fake guns and bullets and red sauces were also used in it) and volunteers enacted as the official (like Investigation Officer, Forensics, Accused, Co-Accused, Police Officer and Witnesses). Each team was given the time slot of 5mins to investigate the crime scene and ask questions to the officials (Volunteers) and prepare the case for the trial in the court for either side.

The next day, pre-trial proceedings were conducted wherein the prosecution and defense teams argued against each other. They critically analyzed the facts and circumstances of the case and presented it before the court. Rebuttal round was also conducted and the teams



rebutted each other's points very confidently. Total 8 teams have qualified for the trial round. This unique exposure enlightened the students' aspects of self-reliance and teamwork. The event was a showcase with a lot of enthusiasm and exuberance. The faculty of law department of TIPS guided the students in organizing this knowledgeable event.

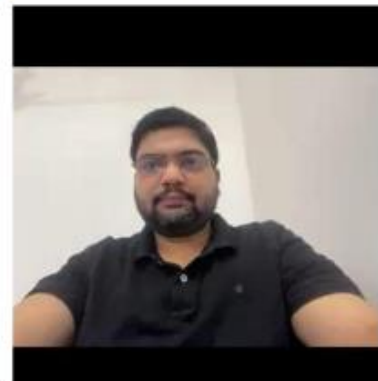
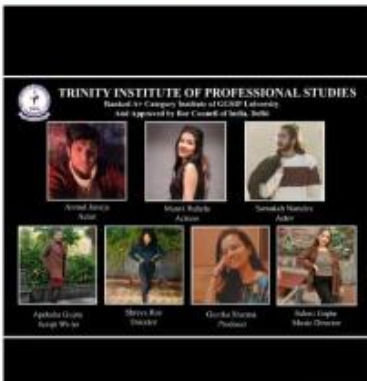


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Pixclusive '22

The session helps the students and all the members not only how they can curb the situation but also why and why today is the need for understanding the awareness the responsibilities as the active citizen on the grounds of humanity.

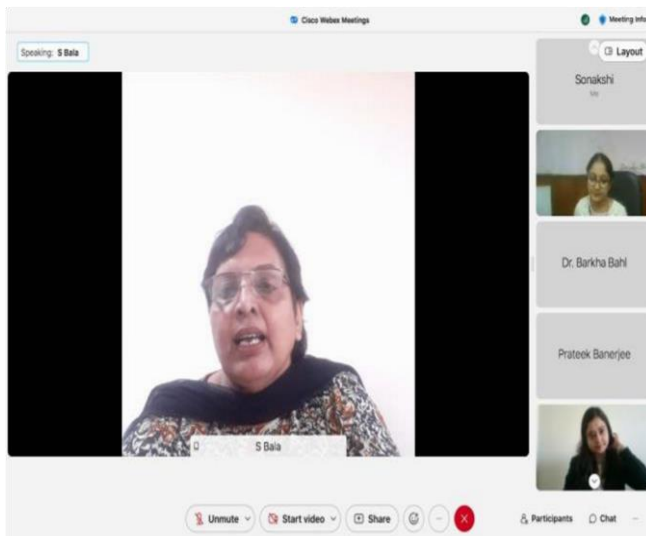
